## School Calendar Pages

To use: print on paper or cardstock. If you like, you can punch holes in the left side and use them in a binder.

I created these as a planning tool for myself for this school year, then thought that others might benefit from them also.

I wanted pages that could go in a binder, and couldn't find a vertical calendar layout anywhere online, so I decided to make them. (They're shifted over to the right so that you can use a hole punch on the left side).

My children are elementary-age and use monthly workplans (much like the free ones found in my Free Downloads—Teacher Tools section).

So, my day-to-day planning is not to plan the work they will do (they make their own choices off the workplan), but to plan the lessons I will give them.

It's also nice to record things like holidays, field trips, and special events. I will continue to do some year-long studies where we do 1-2 lessons a month about the same subject (last year was the Human Body), so I'll use these pages to write that down as well.

I couldn't include holidays since these will be used by people in many countries, but you can write them in.
